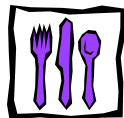

BUILDING COMMITTEE VISION STATEMENT

We believe that God has given us vision for a new addition to our building. This vision is born out of need and mission. We can claim this vision and see it through to completion or abandon it and be left with needs unfulfilled, until through lack of action, the need is no more. This is not a vision for a youth building as some might think. This addition will meet the needs of both the church family and the families of the community as a Family Life Center.

The Family Life Center will consist of a large area for a wide variety of activities for a growing church such as fellowship dinners, Vacation Bible School, concerts and various other activities. In addition, there will be individual classrooms to solve the problem of a lack of classroom space. There will be added storage areas and a larger kitchen to replace a kitchen that has grown too small for our needs.

We will accomplish this vision by the combined efforts of our church family. The structure will rise, not as a result of the size of a fund, but by the character and strength of faith at Center Community Church. We build not only out of necessity, but out of obligation to our God in fulfillment of Matthew 28:19-20*. We build because our purpose as a church compels us to build for the Glory of God.

*Matthew 28:19-20: "Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost: Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you; and lo, I am with you always, even unto the end of the world". Amen.

NBC—New Building Committee—Question / Answer

Will the new addition include storage? Yes. There are storage issues being discussed by Building and Grounds. There are additional plans for storage with the addition of a Family Life Center.

Is it a consideration that the new addition will be built in phases? Yes, it is more feasible that construction will be in phases with emphases on a Family Life Center, Sunday School classes, ADA accessible bathrooms and entryways. There are many needs and wants. The list is ever changing in importance as more ideas are discussed.

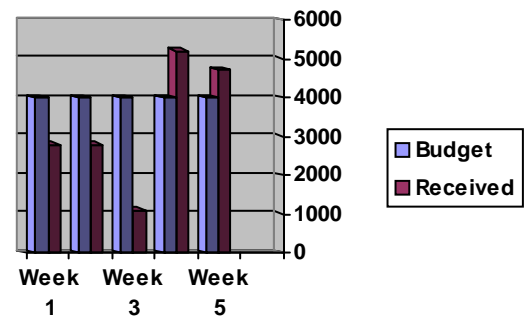

FROM THE MISSION MINISTRY

A.R.M.—AMERICAN REHABILITATION MINISTRIES

Last month I turned 66 ... in prison. As I looked out through the bars, I thanked God for the inmates gathering in the chapel who were “*crops now ripe and ready to be harvested*” John 4:35. I also praised Him for “*filling me with His Spirit, choosing me and sending me to bring good news to the poor, to heal the broken-hearted, to announce release to captives and freedom to those in prison*” Isaiah 61:1. So begins the message from **Joe R. Garman, A.R.M. President** in the January 2011 A.R.M. Newsletter. Of course, Joe wasn’t serving time in the prison. He was serving the Lord, ministering to a prison population, as he has since he and his wife founded A.R.M. in 1973.

You may remember Joe presenting the workings of the American Rehabilitation Ministries last November. Do you remember his funny infectious laugh? I do!!! What wonderful man, and what a wonderful ministry.

From the website www.arm.org: “*AMERICAN REHABILITATION MINISTRIES is an ARM of the church to bring the good news of salvation to those in prison. A.R.M. began ministering to U.S. prisoners in May of 1973 when America’s prison population was only 234,000, where it had hovered since the 1940’s. Today A.R.M. ministers to more than 1.2 million people who are incarcerated in America’s 1,500 state and federal prisons and an additional half-million inmates who occupy our nation’s 3,200 jails.*”

Associated Ministries:

ARM Worldwide Branch Ministries: Serving in the US, Cambodia, Korea, Mexico, Philippines, Russia, and Thailand.

Rapha House: Exists to love, rescue, and heal children who have been rescued out of slavery and sexual exploitation in Southeast Asia—with the goal of expanding globally.

Baptistery Manufacturing: Every 10 minutes someone, somewhere in the world is baptized in a baptistery built by ARM.

American Bible Academy: Is dedicated to providing high quality, advanced Bible correspondence courses to the incarcerated—at no cost.

DaySpring Cards: This Christian greeting card company donates millions of Christian greeting cards to be distributed to federal and state prisons across the United States.

I am so happy and proud that our church is able to help support this very worthy ministry.

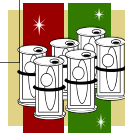
