Somebody Lost Their Baby

You gotta love babies. Yea, they have dirty diapers and cry and have to be fed, burped and dressed. But is their anything more precious? As I hold my granddaughter in my arms, I think about how short a time it has been since I held my own daughter in my arms. She was just as sweet and precious. My little girl has been succeeded by my little granddaughter Sophia. What a terrible thing it would be to lose your little baby.

Somebody lost their baby. Just before I wrote this, I read how 19-year-old Army Pfc. Brett Wood's remains arrived early Monday at Dover Air Force Base in Delaware. Pfc. Brett Wood was killed in Afghanistan by a roadside bomb. He was from Spencer, Indiana. Nineteen years ago, Mrs. Wood held a little baby boy in her arms, and now he has come home for burial. They gave the ultimate sacrifice for their country.

Then I think about someone else who lost a child. Our Father in Heaven gave up His Son to suffer and die on a cross that we might have eternal life. You see, we were lost and dead to God. It took Him giving up his only Son to redeem us that we might be united with our Father in Heaven. God knew that soon He would have His Son back sitting at His right hand for all eternity. However that didn't make it any easier to watch His Son be betrayed, beaten, flogged, tortured, pierced and killed. But it does show how much He loves us. *"For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten son that whoever believes in Him should not perish, but have everlasting life"* – John 3:16

Dear Church Family,

As I was thinking about this article and about what to write, I happened to see a news clip of a motorcyclist involved in an accident. He wound up under a burning car. Suddenly, several men and women in the area, that witnessed the accident, came together and lifted the car. They pulled him free.

Several times recently there have been stories of ordinary people who risked their lives (and sometimes lost them) to aid others.

As a Christian, we are reminded that God gave His one and Only Son to save us from death. Not death of the body, but death of the soul. We are also reminded that it takes more than "good works" to complete this gift of grace. All that we do is done as part of our Christian walk because of our love for Jesus and His Church.

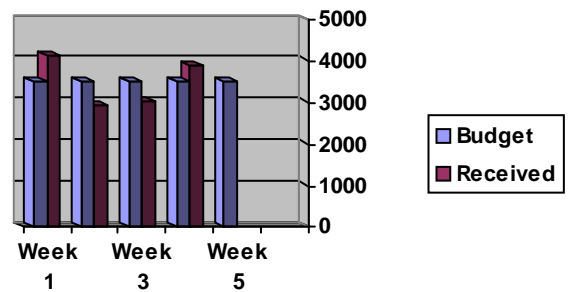

Weekday Religious Education (WRE) is meeting once a week now that school has begun. Fourth graders whose parents give permission, meet once a week at the Plainfield Christian Church to learn about God, the Bible, praying and worshipping God through singing.

The WRE program our church supports regularly has 253 students in it. There are two music leaders, six teachers, and nine bus drivers. Lisa Troupe is the Director. She said recently that there is a need for a sub driver who has a CDL license. WRE provides Bibles if a child doesn't have one.

Juanita Mitchener related that when she was ten years old, she was taken to a church and wondered why they were doing this to her. She soon found out when they taught her the Bible, helped her to pray, and sang Christian songs. This Christian experience early in her life has made a lasting impression on her. We are proud to support this Christian program that teaches young people the Bible. This may be the only Christian training some of them ever receive.
