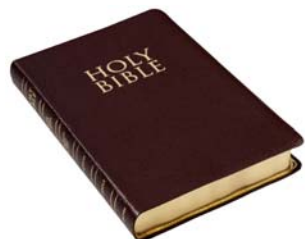

Making Life's Choices

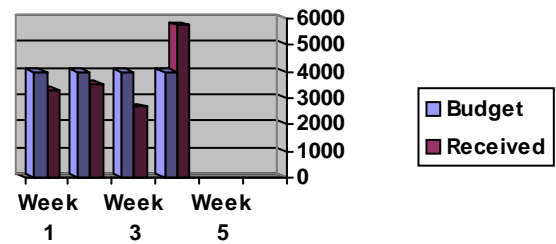

FROM THE MISSION MINISTRY

Central Indiana Crisis Pregnancy Centers is now Life Centers. Their belief statement is: “The Lord Jesus Christ is ‘the way, the truth, and the life’, (John 14:6) and has come that we may have life and have it to the full” (John 10:10).

Life Center’s seven locations in central Indiana provide full services such as pregnancy tests, referrals and maternity support. As a result, each year hundreds of women see Jesus’ love and hundreds of unborn children receive the gift of life.

This is one of the Missions that Center Community Church supports financially, enabling the Center to provide free services to thousands of women, their babies and families. There are 11,000 abortions each year in Indiana. Thirty precious lives are lost every day. Seven thousand of these abortions take place in Marion County.

Volunteers and staff counsel women about pregnancy, show them their babies on an ultrasound and share the good news of Christ. “All we are and all we do at Life Center is all because, ‘One life, Jesus’, just one more life we can save!”
